



welcome to LAKE HOOD

Lake Hood and its surrounding areas are a recreational facility administered by the Lake Hood Board.

Everyone is welcome to make use of the lake, but in return they are expected to: Respect fellow users of this fine facility.

Comply with the rules summarised in this brochure.

Some of the rules have been set by national or regional maritime authorities. Non-compliance can attract prosecutions and fines. Other rules are conditions of entry to Lake Hood and have been put in place to ensure safety and enjoyment for everyone.

VESSEL IDENTIFICATION

To operate any powered boat or jetski on Lake Hood, you will also need to clearly display a registration sticker, which demonstrates your commitment to following our safety guidelines. To register go to: www.lakehood.co.nz

ACCESS

Access gates to the upper reaches of the Lake are locked between 10 p.m. and 7.00 a.m.

OPERATING HOURS & NOISE

- No power boating after 9.00 p.m. or before 7.30 a.m.
- Keep noise to a reasonable minimum so as not to interfere with the safety and enjoyment of all.

RESTRICTED AREAS

For safety purposes some areas of the lake have restrictions sign posted. Please ensure compliance with these directions.

RIGHT OF WAY

- Keep to the right
- Where practicable, circulate anti-clockwise.
- Powered craft give way to sailing craft.

BOAT SKIPPER

- As a boat skipper you have a legal responsibility to ensure compliance with safety rules.
- You must be at least 15 years old to operate a powerboat or jetski.

LIFE JACKETS TO BE WORN

Every person in each boat underway on the lake and canals must wear a lifejacket. (Except for competitors in exempt sports such as rowing and some tournament water ski events).

LAUNCHING RAMPS

- Use the ramps provided rather than launching off beaches.
- Powering boats on to trailers can cause scouring damage to the ramps - please avoid this.
- Launching off any beach is strictly prohibited.

BOAT SPEED

All craft must observe the 5 knots (9 km/h) speed restriction within 50 metres of another boat or person, or in any restricted speed area including all canals.

WATERSKIING

- When towing a skier, "biscuit", etc., you must carry a competent observer aged no younger than 10 years.
- The tournament water ski site has specific rules sign-posted at the site entrance.
- Boat skippers (including wake-board boats): please avoid actions that would damage the shoreline or interfere with ski club equipment.

IET SKIS

- The map overleaf defines the area for jet skis to engage in slalom practice, etc.
- When on the main body of the lake keep well clear so as **not to interfere with other boats or people.** Strictly 5 knots maximum in restricted speed areas.

SWIMMING

- The map overleaf shows a dedicated swimming area at the southwest corner of the lake.
- You may also swim elsewhere but avoid swimming in boat manoeuvring areas – e.g. near launching ramps, jetties, canal and channel entrances.
- No diving or jumping from bridges.

DOGS

No dogs other than Lake Hood residents' dogs are to be brought into the Lake Hood area.

BARBEQUES

Community BBQs have been provided by local service clubs. They are for your use free of charge. Please leave them clean and tidy for the next person to use.

TRAIL AND QUAD BIKES

- Registered road bikes for travelling to and from Lake Hood are permitted when used for that purpose.
- There are no facilities for trail bike riding and the like, and these activities are not permitted within the vicinity of Lake Hood and surrounding areas.
